TO THE RESERVATION RESIDENTS

The Executive Committee would like to extend our thanks to the residents of the Reservation for their patience and cooperation during the construction of the road and waterline.

We know that there have been some problems and inconvenience during the construction. Again, thanks for your cooperation. We feel that someday, each one will benefit in some manner if not already.

WATERLINE

The waterline on the Reservation is near completion. The main lines are now being tested for leaks and malfunctions.

The water tower is now being painted for the second time.

Because of some problems with the workmanship involved in painting the tank, we were unable to accept the paint job. It was a poor inexcusable job of painting and turned out a mess. The Contractors are presently sand-blasting and making preparations to repaint it. Hopefully, this will be the last.

NEW BLACKTOP ROAD

The 31 miles of blacktop road from the Tribal Office west has been finished.

Grading of the shoulders and seeding is all that is left to do to complete the project.

This has been a big improvement for our Reservation and its people.

The Executive Committee has submitted a Resolution designating the road from the Tribal Office east and south to the White Cloud blacktop, as the next priorty. We hope in time this road will also be blacktop.

In fiscal year "86" plans are for the B.I.A. to replace the old bridge east of the Tribal Office. Presently, this bridge is in bad shape, but is being used.

ROAD MAINTENANCE

Through the Road Maintenance Contract the Tribe has with the B.I.A., we are making preparations to open the road a 1 mile north of the Tribal Office. This is an east & west road just north of Neva Keller's, which will bring you out near the White Cloud Place and old rodeo grounds.

The road from the Country Church past the Flanagan Place, down Lucy Curly hill to Roy's Creek is also being repaired and will be graveled.

FARMING OPERATION AND COW/CALF OPERATION

We have just received a couple of nice rains which has given our crops the boost that was so desperately needed. So far the crops look good. We had 53 acres of wheat that has just been harvested. It averaged about 30 bu. per acre. We hoped for a better average, but due to some dry weather and some winter kill, we still came out with a fairly decent profit.

The cattle are doing real well. We presently have 14 cows and 14 calves. There are 10 heifer calves and 4 bull calves.

After we finish cleaning up the stock fields, the steer calves will be sold and we will keep the heifers to enlarge the herd.

The old cows should be having calves again in March.

The guys have been putting up hay and brome for the winter supply of cattle feed.

In next year's farm budget, the cattle operation and farm operation will be included in one budget. The purpose for this being that we are using Tribal land for pasture and hay and need to report the land usage and income to the Bureau, just as we do our farm operation and income.

EXCESS EQUIPMENT SALE

The Executive Committee had received some comments from several Tribal members expressing some concerns about the junk equipment setting around that no longer worked or we didn't utilize.

The B.I.A. was contacted and was told that we would like to dispose of some of the excess equipment that no longer was in operation. This equipment was army surplus, and the Tribe was held accountable for it.

Finally, permission was granted us to have a sale and dispose of it.

They also allowed the Tribe to keep the proceeds of the sale to purchase equipment that we needed.

We also put some old farm machinery on the sale that had been replaced with better equipment. The total receipts from the sale netted \$17,000.00.

We are presently looking for a front end loader, which we badly need in our Road Maintenance work.

BINGO OPERATION

The Bingo Operation has just survived a summer skimp. The past couple of months, the Bingo profits have been sagging, largely due to increased competition in the neighboring communities.

A new schedule has been implemented and now we are back to a good crowd of people again, therefore increasing profits once again. It's looking good!

We like to keep our attendance up at the sessions because this is where the profit comes from. It is extremely important, because a large amount of burial assistance comes from the profits of this Operation, along with employing several people, of which the majority are Reservation residents.

10TH CIRCUIT COURT OF APPEALS

The Tribe is anxiously awaiting a decision involving the case between the Iowa Tribe and the State of Kansas heard March 11, 1985 in Denver. We had hoped to get a decision in 60 to 90 days. This case is of utmost importance to the Tribe in regard to the jurisdiction of the Tribe.

FINANCE DEPARTMENT

The Finance Department has presently got the Financial and Property Management Systems in place and being implemented by the Finance Department. The Property System has been set up with a filing system. We still have to number code all equipment and mark them for future inventories, which is done once a year.

In the last newsletter, we mentioned that we had a Federaf Management Circular A-102 Audit. The results of our audit were very good. A copy of our Audit is maintained at our Tribal Office. Our Audit was prepared by Prosser & Prosser, C.P.A., Falls City, Nebraska.

The Finance Department has presently prepared an overall budget for our fiscal year 1986 contracts & grants. Contracts and grants for FY/86 are being prepared. We will then submit them to the Horton Agency during this quarter, in order to receive funding for 1986.

All bookkeeping and reporting procedures are being implemented by the Finance Department.
