TRIBAL UNPROGRAMMED ACCOUNT

The Tribal Unprogrammed Account which has been in Horton IIM Accounts were moved to Tribal private banks at the request of Horton Agency. This account is where all funds are deposited from the farm.

The Farm Budget and 1/2 of Tribal Operating Budget come from this account. There were \$34,005.54 transferred from the Iowa IIM Unprogrammed Account in Horton to Silver Lake Bank in White Cloud and deposited in Iowa Tribe Unprogrammed Account. (3/17/88)

We later transferred this account to Robinson Bank (5/12/88) There is \$9,622.59 as of 8/18/88 in the Robinson Bank.

The corn and soybeans have not been harvested yet, unds will be deposited in this account.

COMMUNITY BUILDINGS

In 1979, we applied for and received a CDBG from HUD to construct a Community Facility Building on the Reservation and to renovate a building in Rulo, NE for a Community Building. HOUSING

HOUSING

The Housing Authority of the Iowa Tribe was organized by the Iowa Tribe February 11, 1971. In the 70's 50 HUD Mutual Help homes were built on scattered sites located in White Cloud, KS, Rulo, NE, and the Reservation. 50 HUD Low Rent duplexes were built in White Cloud, KS.

In 1985-86, the Housing Authority constructed 22 HUD Mutual Help homes on the Reservation.

NATURAL RESOURCES

Our Natural Resources are extremely limited, they are as follows: 1. Limestone not marketable; 2. Coal - not marketable; 3. Water - adequate to serve Reservation needs; 4. Timber land - limited; 5. Farm land.

The Tribe was funded by HUD in 1983 through a CDBG for a water line project to construct a water treatment plant, a water standpipe, and 6 miles of waterline. We worked with OEH engineers on this project. We contracted out the Treatment Plant and Standpipe and the main waterline. The Tribe layed 2 miles of waterline branching off of the main line. We chose to purchase and trencher and employ Tribal members rather than to contract it out. We leased the trencher to the project and were able to recover a large portion of the cost of the machine. We have a use for the trencher on other jobs.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

FARM OPERATION

Prior to 1980, all Tribal land had been cash rented on the open market. In 1980, the Executive Committee made a decision to start a Farm Operation by farming the land. As the leases expired, we added the land to our Farm Operation. The Farm Program proved successful and a decision was made to increase our land base. In 1982, we purchased 80 acres with a FHA loan. In 1983, we purchased a 72 acre tract and a 40 acre tract with Land Acquisition money set aside from per capita payments. We have managed to acquire our own machinery to do the farming through a loan from the Bingo Plan Account. The loan was repaid by annual installments for a 3 year term. We presently farm 700 acres. We own 1500 acres.

January, 1985, we purchased 14 bred cows with funds borrowed from the Bingo Plan Account, to be paid back over a 5 year period. We keep the bred cows and heifer calves, we sell the steer calves. We have pasture land and raise hay, and keep enough grain to winter feed the cows and calves.

BINGO ENTERPRISE (Iowa Tribe Party Games)

We started an Indian Bingo Operation in July 1982. The Bingo Operation was started as an economic development for the Tribe. The Operation was funded and started by a management group. We received 51% profit and the management group received 49% profit. The Tribe broke its contract with the management group in October 1984. At that time, the Tribe was in position to manage and finance the Bingo Operation with the Tribe having full control of the Operation and also received 100% profit. Before the contract was broke, the Tribe operated at a loss for several months. The crowds were regained and increased. The Bingo Operation is now operating a a nice profit.

The Bingo Operation has enabled the Tribe to be in a position to develop other economic development ventures to work towards self-determination for the Tribe. The Bingo Operation has provided employment for Tribal members and persons from surrounding communities. Presently, the Bingo Operation employs 1 full time manager, and 9 part time employees. The Bingo Operation has helped the economy both on and adjacent to the Reservation.

GRANDVIEW OIL CO.

In 1985, the Tribe applied for a CDBG to build a convenience store and service station. We were not funded.

In 1987, we built and opened Grandview Oil Service Station. We borrowed the funds for the project from Bingo Plan Account. Grandview Oil was more successful that we expected. The debt is being paid off as well as making an expansion of the business.

The Executive Committee is presently working toward locating factories and other economic development projects on the Reservation to cause the Tribe to be more selfsufficient, instead of depending on federal or state funding to survive as a government. We have been held up in the past due to roads and lack of water but are now in a position to promote and develop economic development on the Reservation. VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

In 1987, we received a CDBG in the amount of \$200,000.00 to build a fire station and purchase a new fire truck and equipment. The project was completed in June 1988. The volunteer fire fighters were organized and trained.

IOWA TRIBE CEREMONIAL HONOR GUARD

In 1987, the Iowa Tribe Ceremonial Honor Guard was established. The Honor Guard is a branch of Native American Veterans Association (NAVA). The goal of this organization is to insure that every veteran in the area may be buried with full military honors and dignity that they are entitled to.

This group has made an impression both on the Reservation and in the local communities. They are a very sincere and professional organization. They are a National recognized group made up of Iowa Tribal members, spouses of Tribal members, and other Indians. They are a very impressive group of people. CONTRACTS AND GRANTS

The Tribe has a complete audit of all accounts at the end of each fiscal year. We receive a clean audit each year.

COMMUNITY HEALTH REPRESENTATIVE

We administer a CHR Contract funded by IHS. We have 1 CHR. She assists the Medical Staff at White Cloud Satelite Clinic. She makes home visits, arranges medical appointments, makes referals to SRS, Social Security Offices, works with young mothers to utilize the WIC Program, assists clients with energy programs, and trnasports some patients to medical facilities if they have no other means of transportation. She acts as a liason between clients and professional staff.

ROAD MAINTENANCE

We administer a Road Maintenance Contract through BIA. The Road Maintenance Contract makes it possible to provide better roads on the Reservation. Through this Contract, we gravel, put in tubes, maintain 28 3/4 miles of Reservation roads. This Contract allows us to employ Tribal members. We borrowed the funds to purchase a rock truck. We are able to lease this truck to the program to haul the rock. This allows us to haul the rock and employ a driver. This Contract allows the Tribe to employ some Tribal members.

AID TO TRIBAL GOVERNMENT

The Aid to Tribal Government Contract is utilized to provide 90% of the Grantee Administrator, and also subsidize Council meetings, travel, and utilities. We have been able to update our enrollment, keep addresses and names current. We are continuing to put information in the computer that will be obtainable for various reasons such as population, location, etc.

CEMETARIES

We have four cemetaries on the Reservation. The Tribal employees are able to maintain the cemetaries. The Tribal employees offer their services to Tribal members to open and close grave sites.

The Reservation and surrounding communities are especially attractive to young families due to the healthy environment and extremely low crime rate. The schools in the area are excellent.

Recreational activities consist of sports, hunting, fishing, boating, bingo, flea markets, annual rodeo, and pow wows.

We have two churches located on the Reservation. A Tribal member is the pastor of one church.

Our immediate needs are economic development to provide employment and more hard surfaced roads.
