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Foreword

This continues the march of digitization of resources for the Jiwere Language: Dorsey's Comparative Siouxan vocabulary has been transcribed from a set of notecards photographed by the Smithsonian Institute. Through digitization, these notecards have been reformatted into tables, with a line for each language featured. Additionally, special characters have largely been omitted from the original work. Given that this digitization is focused on Jiwere primarily, phonetic pronunciations have been included in the Jiwere line of each table where applicable, rendering aforementioned special characters useless for our purposes. Take close note of the many inconsistencies present in this work compared to Hamilton & Irvin, Dr. Lila Wistrand-Robinson, and Jimm Goodtracks. This is a rather unreliable source for ascertaining Jiwere translations but is still useful in tracing the evolution of the written language, as the way these words are spelled represent a unique middle point in the transition from older spelling frameworks to newer ones accepted today.
